

## CONDITIONS FOR ACCEPTANCE

# Residual waste

### CONDITIONS

#### Allowed:

The competent authority understands residual waste to be:

- Waste generated as a consequence of an industrial, artisanal or scientific activity
- Waste put on an equal footing with business waste by government decree.

#### Prohibited:

- Maximum dimensions: board: 1m x 1m x 0.1 m; cube: 0.5m x 0.5m x 0.5m (larger = technically non-combustible)
- Strings, threads, ribbons, rolls, etc.
- Powdery products
- Waste must be in solid form
- Free fluid
- PVC
- Substances that cause an exothermic reaction, hot or warm waste, (highly) flammable goods
- Railway sleepers, tree stumps, ship ropes, concrete blocks (with rebars) or polyester tanks
- Non-combustible waste: Glass wool, rock wool, glass fibre, etc.
- Animal by-products from CAT. 1, 2 or 3

The following waste must be collected separately and must not therefore be added to the residual waste: worden gevoegd:

- Small Hazardous Waste of similar business origin
- Glass waste
- Paper and cardboard waste
- Used vegetable or animal oils or fats
- Green waste
- Textile waste
- Discarded electrical and electronic equipment
- Waste tyres
- Rubble
- Used oil
- Hazardous waste (including empty packaging bearing the hazard symbol)
- Asbestos-containing waste
- Discarded appliances and containers that contain ozone-depleting substances or fluorinated greenhouse gases
- Waste agricultural films
- Discarded batteries and accumulators
- Wood waste
- Metal waste
- PMD waste
- Recyclable rigid plastics
- Expanded polystyrene (EPS, Styropor)
- Films

In case of non-conformity, the collector reserves the right to reject the load in question and/or to pass on any extra costs of collection and processing.
